He is an economist and holds a Master's degree in Financial Economics from the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile. Mario Marcel - Minister of Finance Chile



Mario Marcel is a Commercial Engineer from the University of Chile and M. Phil. in Economics from the University of Cambridge, UK. He assumed as Minister of Finance of the Government of Gabriel Boric in March 2022.

In 2015 he became Board Member of the Central Bank of Chile. In 2016 he was appointed President of that institution, a position he held until the end of January 2022.

Previously, he was Director of the Global Good Governance Practice of the World Bank; Deputy Director of Public Governance and Territorial Development of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), and Manager of the Department of Institutional Capacity and Finance of the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB).

For 13 years he worked for the Government of Chile in the Ministry of Finance. Between 2000 and 2006 he was Director of the Budget Office. In addition, he served as a researcher for the Corporation for Latin American Studies (Cieplan).

Also, he is the author of numerous publications on a wide range of topics, including areas such as macroeconomics, public finance, monetary policy, governance and public management, social policies and social security.

David Gallagher - Former Chilean Ambassador to the UK



David Gallagher was Ambassador of Chile to the UK between 2018-2022. Mr. Gallagher was a lecturer in Latin American Literature at Oxford University and Fellow of St. Antony's College, Oxford. With Morgan Grenfell he was in charge of Latin American business, and director of Morgan Grenfell International.

Solange Berstein – Chairwoman of the Financial Market Commission



She holds a PhD in Economics from Boston University; a master’s degree in Economics from the Ilades/Georgetown University Program; and a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration from Universidad de Santiago.

She is a recognized expert in the fields of financial market and pension public policies. Prior to joining the Commission, Berstein headed the Financial Policy Management Division of the Central Bank of Chile from 2017 to 2022 and was a Senior Pension Specialist at the Inter-American Development Bank between 2015 and 2017.

Ms. Berstein was Head of Studies at the Superintendence of Pensions between 2003 and 2006 and chaired said institution from 2006 to 2014. In the latter period she was part of the International Organization of Pension Supervisors' Technical Committee (as both Vice-President and President).

Berstein has also been a member of the Financial Stability Board; the Capital Markets Committee; and the Chilean Risk Classification Commission, where she served as President. Between 2005 and

2007 she worked as a consultant for the World Bank and was Senior Economist at the Research Division of the Central Bank of Chile from 2001 to 2003.

The presentation will focus on how gender gaps have evolved in the Chilean financial market in the last years and how that has impacted the way the markets have developed in terms of technology, innovation, and inclusion. It is essential to provide such information to the market to improve transparency and the decision-making processes. We will mention how female participation in boards of directors has increased in the last years, changes in Chilean law to ensure an equal level of participation and how that trend affects risk management.
